**LOCAL DOCTOR GRADUATES LAW SCHOOL AND ACHIEVES
DISTINGUISHED SCHOLAR STATUS**

Dr. David Satloff, a Providence native and Clinical Director of the Southern New England Holistic Dental Center in North Attleboro and of the Seekonk Dental Care facility, recently completed his EJD law degree from Concord University School of Law and was named today as a distinguished scholar based upon his academic achievement by the school.

Dr. Satloff has written legal commentaries on motor vehicle accident trauma in relation to his previous academic studies at University of Miami School of Medicine where he earned his masters degree in trauma in conjunction with Lynn University.

Dr. Satloff also has written about dental informed consent standard of care. Pursuant to the new FDA policy regarding mercury based dental fillings, "it is incumbent upon the treating dentist to fully disclose the toxicity of any and all dental restoratives and to test for biocompatibility with the consumer's unique biochemistry."

Satloff received his DMD in dentistry from Tufts University (1981), MS in biomechanical trauma from Lynn University (1997), MBA from Bryant College (1986), CAGS in health care management from Bryant College (1990), certification in Traditional Chinese Medicine from Chengdu University (2003), certification in TM disorders from Tufts University (1988), certification in aesthetic dentistry from CWRU (1991) and Tufts University (1995), and is a MD candidate at UHSA School of Medicine. Dr. Satloff is most proud of his volunteer efforts in the AO Peace Corps program (1981-1982) and in China (2003).

Satloff is the first university trained dentist in aesthetic dentistry in New England and possess both Fellowship and Mastership status in the Academy of General Dentistry. He is also recognized as the first dentist in the United States to achieve diplomat status in the American Academy of Pain Management and named editorial advisor to the Journal of Pain Management.
